


TIP Programming Overview: MPO-Evaluated Projects

- In total, 24 projects were evaluated in FFY19
 - 11 projects proposed for funding with Regional Target funds
 - 3 proposed for funding with MassDOT funds

TIP Programming Overview: Additional Notes

- New/additional funding allocated to two programs:
 - Community Transportation Program (\$2,000,000 in both FFYs 2022 and 2024)
 - MBTA Modernization Program (\$22,116,687 in FFY 2021) OR additional highway project
- Specific projects for these programs will be determined at a later date



TIP Programming Overview: Additional Notes

- Four projects moved into later programming years:
 - Intersection Improvements in Beverly (2019 to 2020)
 - Rutherford Avenue in Boston (2020 to 2022)
 - Lynnfield Street in Lynn (2020 to 2021)
 - Atlantic Avenue in Hull (2021 to 2022)
- Three projects moved into earlier programming years:
 - South Main Street in Bellingham (2023 to 2022)
 - Route 2A in Littleton/Ayer (2023 to 2021)
 - Route 28/Hopkins Street in Reading (2023 to 2021)
- Two new projects programmed early
 - Route 38 in Wilmington (2023)
 - Edgell Road/Central Street in Framingham (2022)

Goals for Programming:


- Keep projects on original schedules



- Turn lanes and upgraded traffic signals installed at Route 62
- Traffic signal installation and roadway alignment at Route 38 and Cross Street/Butters Row
- Addition of bike lanes
- Addition of sidewalk on one side of roadway

- Traffic signal upgrades at Bathing Beach



Road diet and new bike lanes on Route 16

- Installation of two new traffic signals and reconstruction of two existing signals
- Sidewalk reconstruction and crosswalk improvements throughout project area
- Reconfiguration of turn lanes throughout project area

- Pavement reconstruction
- Drainage improvements
- New curb installation
- Installation of two new pedestrian crossings and beacons

Upgrading traffic signals for improved visibility

- Addition of four new left-turn lanes and one right-turn lane
- Addition of bicycle lanes on all four intersection approaches
- New and rehabilitated sidewalks, crosswalks, and pedestrian signals

- Addition of bike lanes on all four approaches
- Reconfiguration of roadway geometry to improve sight distances
- Installation of two turn lanes
- Reconfiguration of 3 existing pedestrian islands to create 1 island



- Establish a Federal Railroad Administration
 Quiet Zone at railroad crossings at Cherry Street
 and Main Street
- Close gaps in pedestrian sidewalk network
- Pavement reconstruction
- Improved roadway drainage

- Final northern link of the Neponset River
 Greenway, from Senator Joseph Finnegan Park to Morrissey Boulevard
- 10-foot paved, shared-use path

 Green Line Riverside T station

Lynn: Traffic and Safety Improvements at Two Locations on Broadway (609254)

Funding: \$6,809,548 (FFY 2024)

Project Type: Intersection Improvements

Description:

 Signalization of stop-controlled intersection at Jenness Street

- Replacement of non-compliant traffic signals
- Reconstruction of sidewalks, crosswalks, and wheelchair ramps
- Addition of bicycle facilities
- Roadway resurfacing

TIP Programming: Unfunded Projects

- Primary reasons for not funding projects:
 - Projects are not currently municipal/state priorities (readiness)
 - Major infrastructure projects are not currently listed in LRTP
 - Projects are too high-cost, given fiscal constraints of existing programming obligations
- In total, there were 10 projects evaluated this year that remain unfunded



Recap: Key Takeaways

- 14 out of 24 projects evaluated by the MPO this year have been proposed for funding
- No new Major Infrastructure projects were funded
- Funding held in FFY 2021 for an MBTA Modernization program OR additional highway project
- Community Transportation Program funding was restored in FFY 2022 and continued in FFY 2024
- Project readiness and cost change issues are primary drivers of degree of flexibility in TIP programming
