- Survey (December 2019): Most important goals for transportation projects
  - 1. Equity (73%)
  - 2. Pedestrian safety (55%)
  - 2. Promoting economic development (55%)
  - 2. Prioritizing buses (55%)
  - 5. Bicycle safety (45%)
  - 5. Reducing emissions (45%)

#### Benefits

- More legible system
- Higher Equity weighting
- Retains importance of Safety and System Preservation
- More focused criteria
- Drawbacks
  - Fewer gradations within criteria
  - Introduction of extra calculation
